## **RESOLUTION NO. 2000-**150

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF INDIAN RIVER COUNTY, FLORIDA, FORMALLY ACCEPTING THE DEDICATION OF STREETS. ALLEYS AND PLATS EASEMENTS SHOWN ON CERTAIN PREDATE WHICH STATUTORY LAWS OF PLATTING SET OUT IN CHAPTER 177, PART 1, FLORIDA STATUTES.

WHEREAS, laws relating to the platting of land were not enacted by the Florida Legislature until 1971; and

WHEREAS, plats filed of record prior to that date sometimes had no language of express dedication of rights-of-way, streets, alleys and easements to public use; and

WHEREAS, by making a sale of platted lots, the owner of a tract manifests an intent to dedicate streets and rights-of-way necessary to access those lots; and

WHEREAS, common law dedication requires (1) an intention by the owner to dedicate the property for public use; and (2) an acceptance by the public; and

WHEREAS, Judge Scott Kenney rendered a Final Judgment in the case <u>Driver v. Indian River County</u>, in the Nineteenth Judicial Circuit, in and for Indian River County, Florida (Case No. 00-0343 CA19) ruling that there must be clear, satisfactory and unequivocal evidence that the public has accepted such dedications, either formally, or by the improvement, maintenance or use of said streets and rights-of-way.
