

CSRC hosted 58 hiring events, both in our Career Centers, and onsite at businesses. With over 2,700 career seekers attended, resulting in 250+ hires.





To address the shortage of Registered Nurses in the Research Coast, CSRC applied for and received a grant to train additional nurses. 20 nursing students

were selected to receive their full two-year RN training including support services, paid at Indian River State College. In addition CSRC pledged to sponsor 20 additional nurses through the WIOA training allocation, at \$4,000 each.



Manufacturing Apprenticeship



Industrial Manufacturing Technician Apprenticeship and supporting Pre-Apprenticeship

The Strategic Development team successfully registered the IMT apprenticeship and pre-apprenticeship in the state of Florida. With the IMT, apprentices gain on-the-job-learning in the critical manufacturing work processes and related tasks and participate in formal education, preparing them for career advancement opportunities in the manufacturing industry.
