

Re: Wieler and Town of Indian River Shores v. Horse's Head, Ltd. and St. Johns River Water Management District

Dear Mary Jane:

In his April 15, 1999 correspondence, Kenneth R. Macht, Chairman of the Indian River County Board of County Commissioners, essentially asserts that the County owns the right-of-way proposed for mitigation purposes on Hole-in-the-Wall Island by virtue of an action taken by the St. Lucie County Commission on June 2, 1923. Simply put, Mr. Macht is mistaken. Leaving aside for the moment the obvious fact that this same right-of-way has been abandoned by the County by virtue of some 40 years or more of non-use, the Board of County Commissioners of Indian River County, Florida adopted a resolution on or about December 16, 1959, a copy of which is attached hereto, stating in relevant part:

- That this Board has hereto fore determined upon its own motion by resolution
 duly adopted to vacate, abandon, discontinue, close and renounce and
 disclaim any right of said County and the public in and to any land in
 connection with certain public roads and parts thereof described as follows:
 - F. Any and all other public County roads situated within the limits of the Town of Indian River Shores, except, however, the following. . . [emphasis supplied]

The resolution then goes on to except from the coverage of this paragraph certain roads or parts thereof lying elsewhere in the Town of Indian River Shores but clearly and unmistakably not excepting from the ambit of this paragraph the road/right-of-way on Hole-in-the-Wall Island (which is located within the territorial limits of the Town). In other words, by clear and unequivocal official action in 1959, the Indian River County Board of County Commissioners took the very action that Mr. Macht in his correspondence claims has never been done, i.e., the abandonment of the right-of-

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way by the County. Mr. Macht should do his homework better.

I hope and trust that this resolves this late-blooming and spurious claim. Of course, if you have any other questions, please do not hesitate to give me a call.

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RESOLUTION

BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners of Indian River County, Florids, that this Board does herewith find and determina es follows:

1. That this Board has herewfore determined upon its own motion by resolution duly adopted to vacate, abandon, discontinue, close and recounce and disclaim any right of said County and the public in and to say land to connection with certain public roads and parts thereof described se follows:

> A. That portion of the 200-foot dedication now used for State Road No. AlA as shown on Replay No. 2 of Southern Shores Subdivision, according to plat thereof recorded in Plat Book 2, page 66, of the public records of Indian River County, Florida, lying more than aixty (60) feet from the Baseline of Survey as shows on the right of way map of Section 8807-102, State Road AIA, alled in the office of the Clerk of the Circuit Court for lodian River County, Florida, EXCEPTING therefrom area needed for 25-foot radial returns at Beachcomber Lane.

B. . All that part of the right of way of former State Road AlA extending from the North line of Silver Shores Subdivision, Usics Nos. 1 and 2, according to plats thereof recorded in the office of the Clerk of the Circuit Court of Indian River County, Plotida, la Plat Book 4, pages 45 and 69, respectively, to the South line of the Town of Indian River Stores, as the seme dow exists, that lies outside the limits of State Road No. AlA, according to the right of way map of Section 8807-102, State Road AIA, as filed in the office of the Clerk of the Circuit Court of Indian River. County, Florida.

C. All that part of the public County road as dealgeated in Minute Book 1, page 372, of the Board of County Commissioners of St. Lucie County, Plocida, commonly known as the Johns Island Road, that Hea within the limits of the Town of Indian River Stores, which said road is described as follows:

Beginning at the South end of the Orchid and Narrows Road running Southeast 392 feet to the division line between the McDonald and Dannell land, thence Basi 2088 feet to the Southeast corner of the McDonald land, then due South between the Dannell and Asker land to the bidlen River 1508 feet corner with J.J.P. Hamilton, then sleng river to D. H. Mathle Northwest corner, then along Indian River to Southwest corner of Covernment Let No. 8, Section 36, Township 31 South, Range

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39 East, to a cabbage tree in front of the Ed. Walker-house, thence South 45 degrees East to the South corner of Lot 8, Section 18, Township 32 South, Range 40 East, then one-half mile South on half section lire, then East 900 feet, then 18 degrees East of South to Public School House, then same direction to a point 350 feet North of the Chamberlain house, thence East to Adantic Ocean, thence along basch 4375 feet to Pahn Avenue, then Wast on Paim Avenue 3450 feet to Indian River Drive, then South on Indian River Drive 450 feet to Live Oak Avenue, then 1000 feet South on Lansan Avenue, then West to Bridge. Said road to be 30 feet wide.

All that part of the County public road as described in Minute Book 4, page 77, of the Beard of County Commissioners of St. Lucie County, Florida, described as follows:

Beginning at a point on the East bank of Indian River which is 2230. 3 feet South and 254. 1 feet Wost of the intersection of the East bank of Indian River with the North line of Township 32 South, Range 39 East, run North 60 degrees and 20 minutes East 45 feet, thence on a 12 degree and 0 minute curve to the loft 348 feet, thence North 18 degrees and 30 minutes East 690 feet, more or less, to apoint which is 1320 feet South of the aforesaid Township line. Thence East and parallel to the said Township line 4230 feet, more or less, to the Adande Ocean. The right of way of said road to be 70 feet wide:

EXCEPT, however, that part thereof which lies in Covernment Lors I and 2 in Section 1, Township 32 South, Range 39 East.

B. All that part of the right of way of former State Road AlA extending from the South limits of the Town of Indian River Shores to the North limits of the Town of Indian River Shores lying outside the limits of State Road AlA, according to the right of way map of Section 8507-102, State Road AlA, as filled in the office of the Clerk of the Circuit Court of Indian River County, Florids; EXCEPT, however, that part thereof described as follows:

Any and all parts thereof lying in Covernment Lots I and 2, Section 1. Township 32 South, Range 39 East, and except any parts thereof lying North of said section.

- F. Any and all other public County roads situated within the limits of the Town of Indian River Shores, EXCEPT, however, the following:
- (1) That part thereof which lies in Covernment Lots 1 and 2 in Section 1, Tuwnship 32 South, Range 39 East.
- (2) Any and all parts of former State Road A1A lying in Covernment Lots 1 and 2, Section 1, Town: ship \$2 South, Range 39 East, and except any parts thereof lying North of said section.

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(3) From the gate across the old County road, said gate lying 33 feet South and 15 feet West of the Southeast corner of Government Lot 1, Section 1, Township 32 South, Range 39 East, run North 9 degrees 11 minutes East a distance of 70, 62 feet to the centerline of old State Road AIA, the same being the point of beginning; thence run 219, 34 feet along the are of a curve concave to the North, said curve having a radius of 991, 12 feet to the P.C.; thence North 67 degrees 15 minutes 30 seconds East a distance of 1290 feet to Station 306 + 28, 7 on the centerline of State Road AIA secording to the right of way map of Section 8807 - 102, as filed in the office of the Cierk of the Circuit Court of Indian River County, Piorida.

(4) The North 70 foot of that part of the South 11.5 acres of Government Lot 10, Section 36, Township 31 South, Range 39 East, that lies East of State Road AIA, according to the right of way map of Soction \$807-102.

All of the same now being in Indian River County, Florids.

- 2. That this Board has published notice thereof one time in the Vero Beach Press Journal, a newspaper of general circulation in indian River County, Florida, said publication being published at least two (2) weeks prior to the date stated therein for such public hearing, as will more fully appear by proof of publication filed in the records of this Board.
- 3. That each of the above described public roads is not a state or federal highway.
- 4. That a public hearing thereon has been held by the Board of County Commissioners of Indian River County, Florida, in the office of said Board in the Indian River County Courthouse, Vero Boach, Florida, on .

 December 1, 1959, at 10:00 o'clock A.M.;

BB IT PURTHER RESOLVED that this Board does herewith vacate, abandon, discontinue, close, resource and disclaim any right of the County and the public in and to any land in connection with the existing public roads bereinbefore described.
